
ELM BARK BEETLE TRAP



- 1. Cut heavy string or rope with sufficient length to go around pole or tree.
- 2. Position through holes as shown.
- Remove lures from packet, and attach to trap in center box.
- 4. Position on pole or tree (other than elm) glue surface out, approximately 3 meters off the ground. Tie strings to attach.



Traps should be set up in spring, usually late April thru mid-May, just after bud break. Replace traps as needed if beetle catch completely fills trapping surface.

NOTE: The Elm Bark Beetle lure is "season long". New lures are not necessary with each trap replacement. Be sure to remove lure from old trap and attach to new one.

Traps should be placed from 150' to 650' apart in open areas and be clearly displayed (not hidden by foliage).

A distance of at least 150' must be maintained between a trap and the nearest elm trees.

Place lure in the designated area. Do not place lure on sticky material; effectiveness may be limited.

Mark trap with setup date and trap number for identification using permanent marker.

Traps should be maintained through summer and into fall, usually until a hard frost.

NOTE: Because of the way the trap is folded is shipping, there may be some separation in the adhesive pattern. If entire trap surface is not coated sufficiently, close trap and press together firmly one or more times, then reopen. This should properly redistribute glue pattern.

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
